

Help you make better decisions....




1- How life most likely will be

2- The life if option 1 was not possible


3- The life you can have if \$ was of no importance













This cannot be done:


In a 1- credit asynchronous class, requires in-person interactions

AND...I cannot take the time to learn all of this


BUT THEN.....

Expectancy Theory

Victor Vroom

- •Individuals will behave in a certain way based on the expected behavior
- •Ex.: Students that learn APA will have an easier time writing Making X choice will lead to the desired result

Learning is more likely to occur when employees (students) believe that they can learn the content of the program (Expectancy)

Expectancy

Effort correlates to performance

Self-confidence is the belief that the effort will lead to better performance



Instrumentality

Good performance will result in fulfilling the reward

It is the belief that Performance is low if the outcome is vague



Valence

Reward fulfills an important need

It is the <u>unique</u> value an individual has toward a goal


